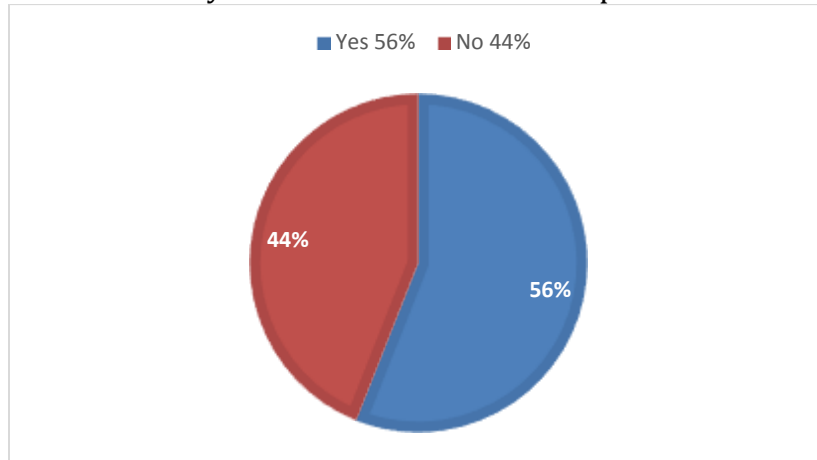


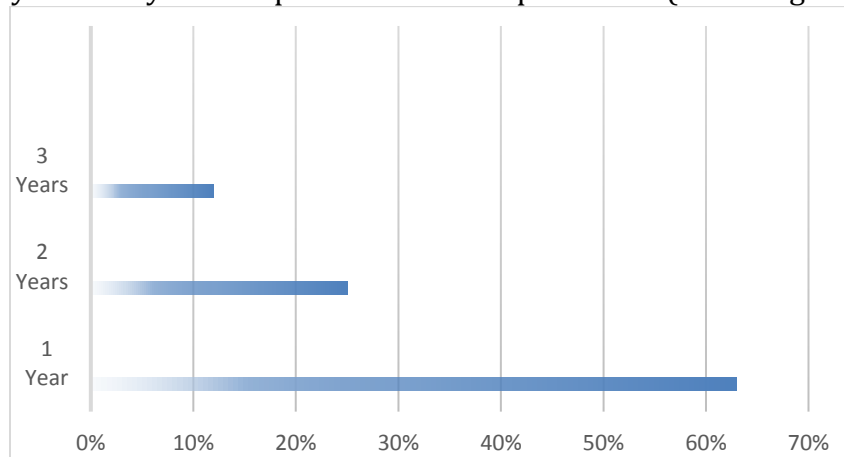

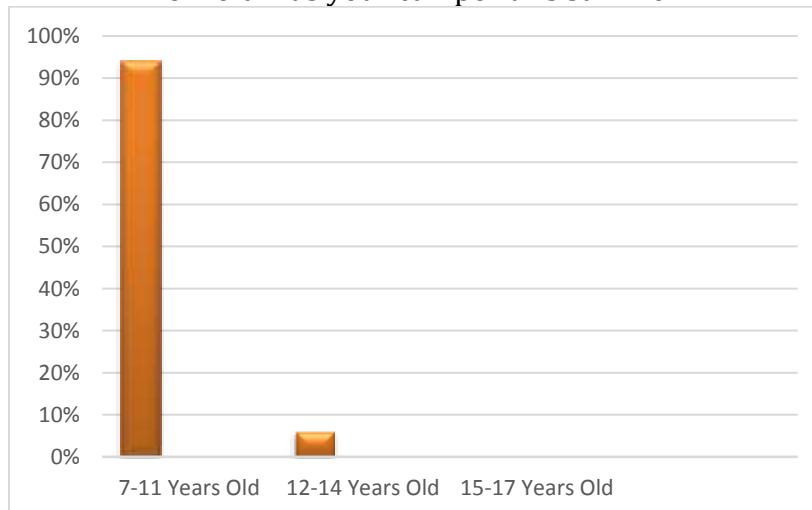
Was this your child's first time at Camp DeWolfe?



How many years has your camper attended Camp DeWolfe (including this summer)?



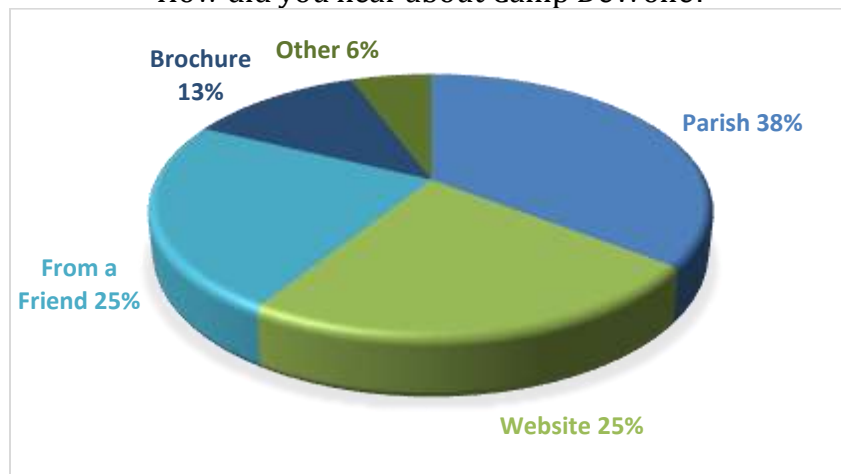
How old was your camper this summer?



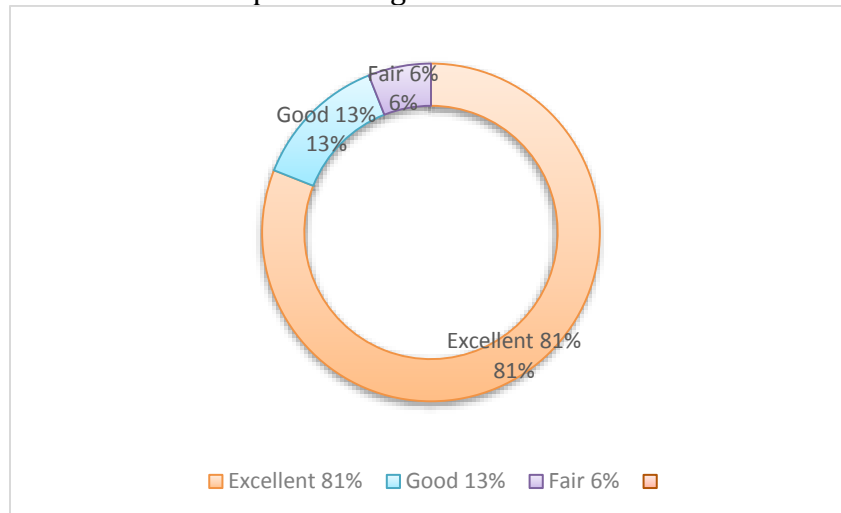

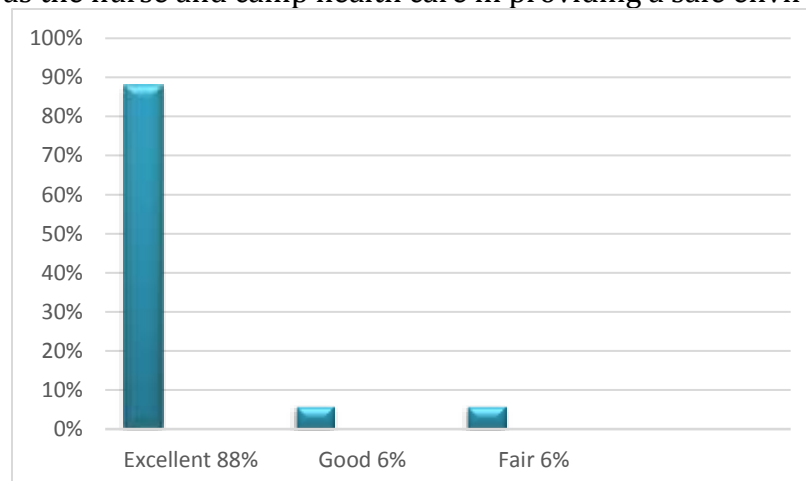

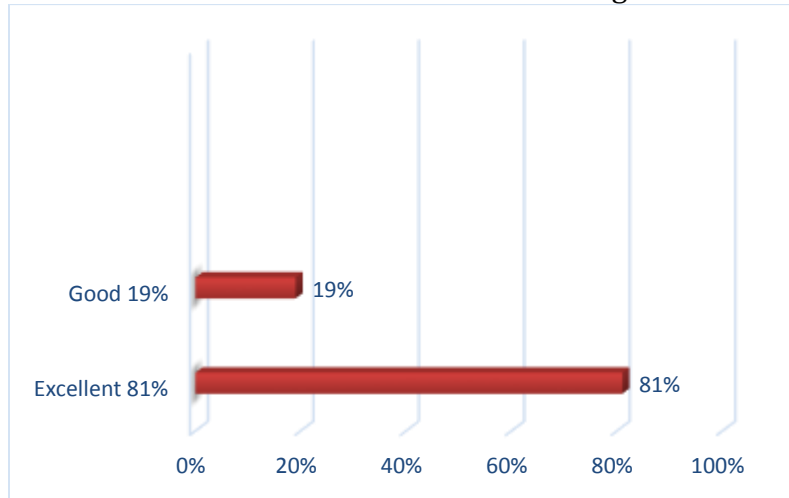
How was the nurse and camp health care in providing a safe environment?

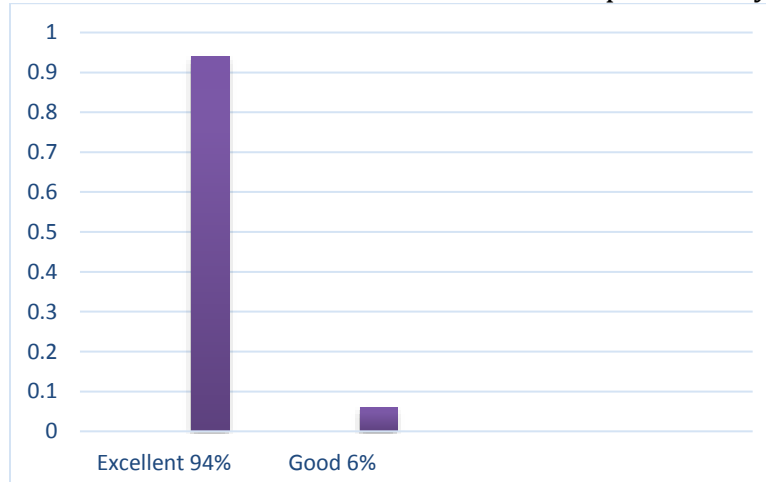
How clear and efficient was the online registration?



How were the session dates for your family?



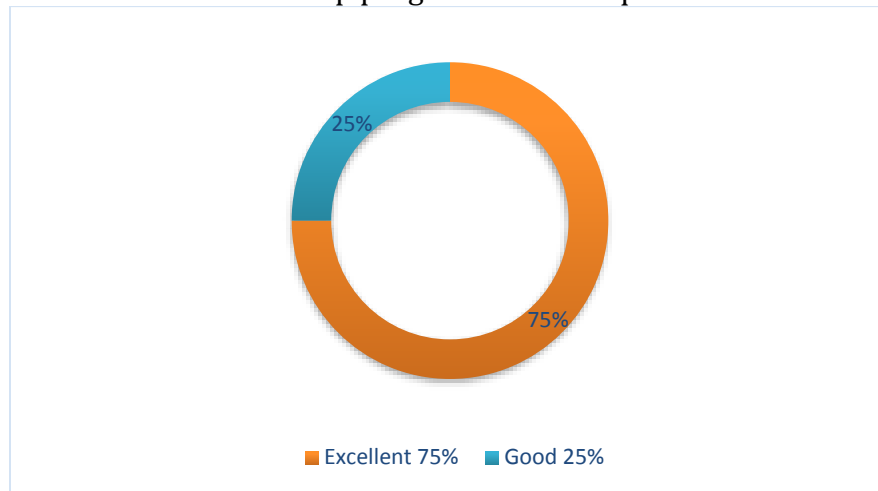
How was the Food Service – varied and camper-friendly?



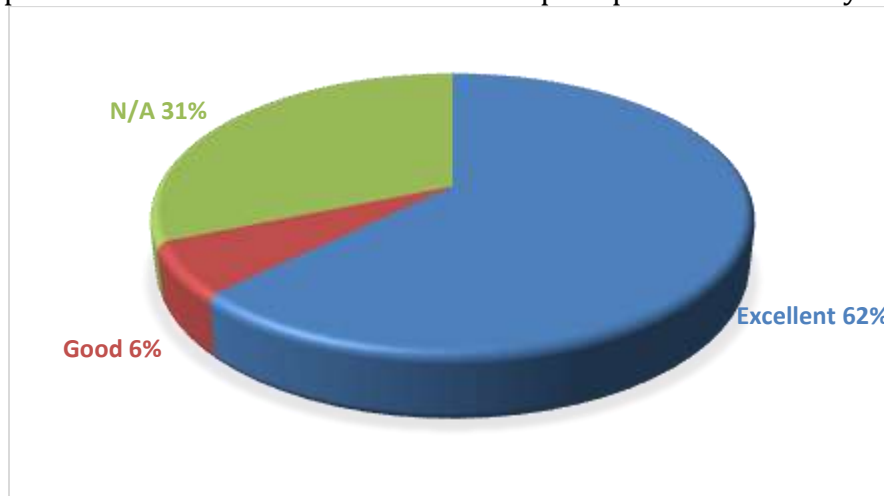

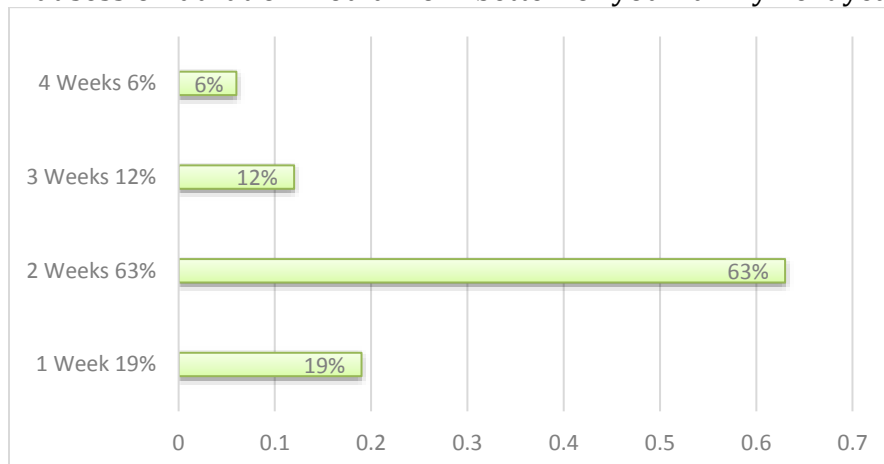
Were camp program rates adequate?



How helpful was the financial assistance from Episcopal Ministries or your parish?



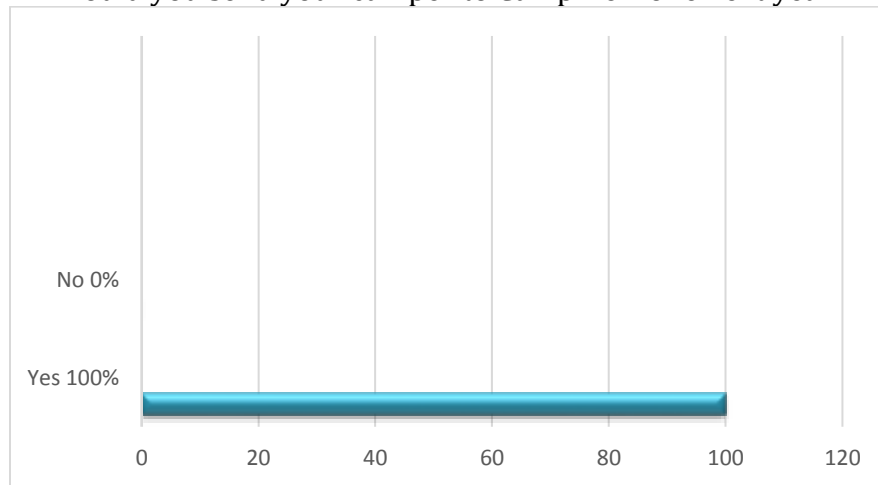
What session duration would work better for your family next year?

- My camper was very excited to be there, she learned a lot about devotion, self-confident, changes, and growth.

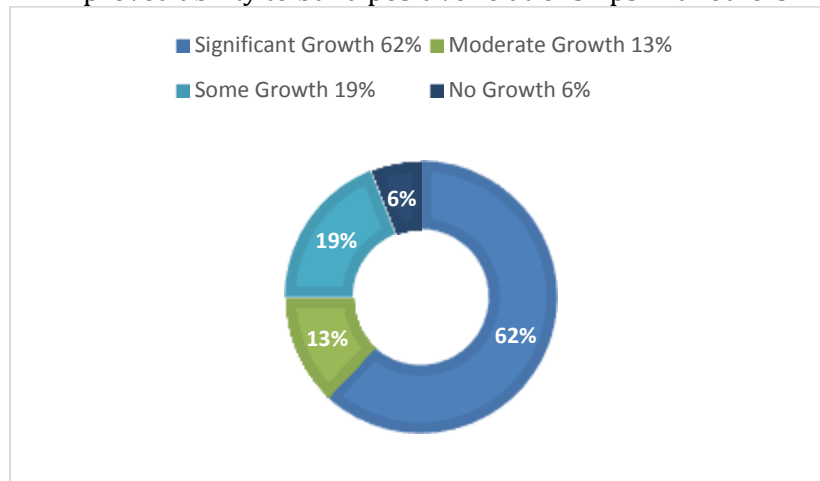

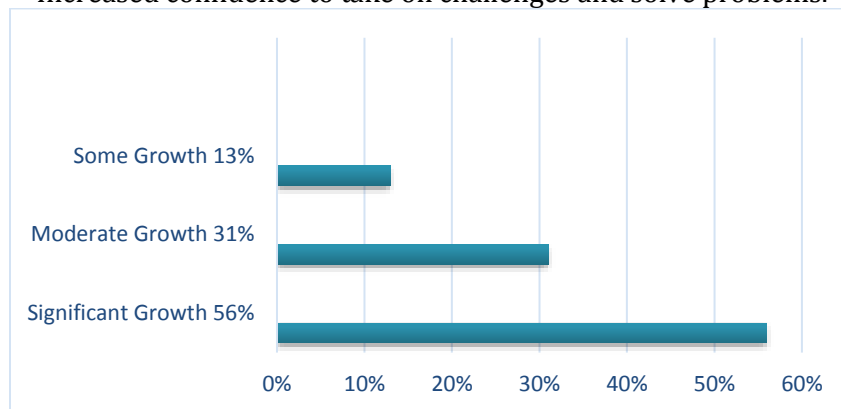

Rate the following on this scale: 1. No growth... 3 Some growth... 5 Significant growth.”

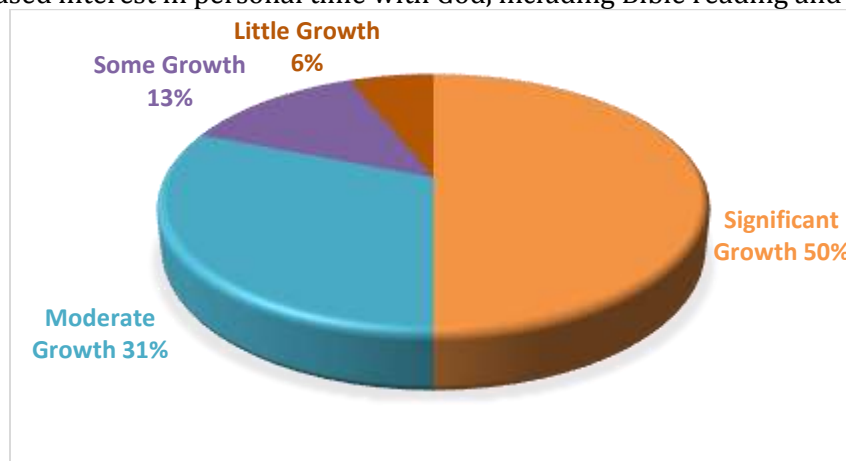
Improved ability to build positive relationships with others.



Increased confidence to take on challenges and solve problems.



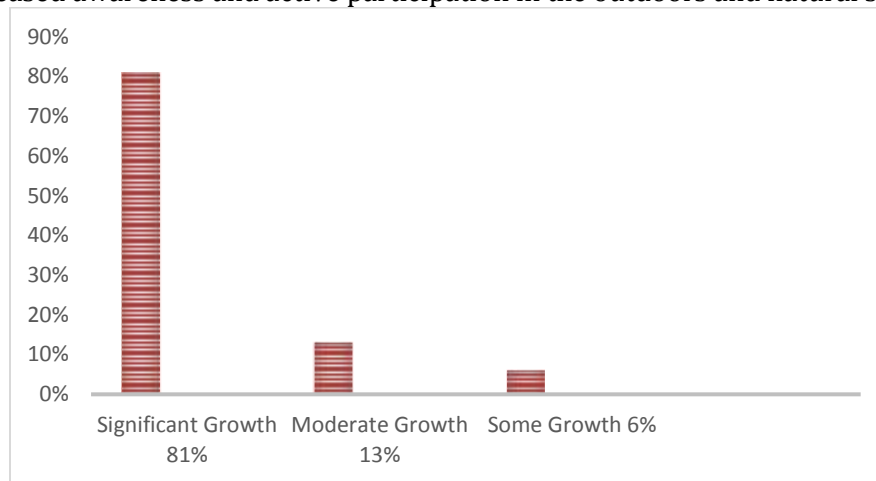
Increased interest in personal time with God, including Bible reading and prayer.
